During the first MHM trips to Haiti and for many, many subsequent medical trips, an outpatient clinic was defined as a trip to a remote location, carrying our medicine in tow. As we learned more and more throughout the years, we began wondering what was happening when groups were not in Haiti. Where are the patients going for medical care? Why are Haitian medical professionals struggling to find jobs outside of Port au Prince? Could we provide a partially subsidized method to provide indigenous employment of medical professionals? We realized we were part of the problem. The idea of an indigenously staffed and partially supported outpatient clinic was the initial step toward birthing a hospital in Saintard. With three original staff members providing outpatient care 1-2 days a week, the clinic grew to be open five days a week. Now our outpatient services include a pediatrician 4 days per week, an internist 2 days per week (with ECG's as needed), OB/Gyn's (with ultrasound and sonography as needed) 2 days per week, orthopedic consultations 2 days per week, additional specialty ultrasound services 1 day per week and family practice medicine through a collaboration with experienced practitioners and residents from the medical school in Port au Prince, 6 days per week.
